

Evangelism Tips - 4 Leader's Guide

- 1. What is an evangelist? What person in the Bible is called an evangelist?**
(An evangelist is someone who shares the good news about Jesus. Philip is called an evangelist.)
- 2. What does the angel ask Philip to do? (The angel tells Philip to leave the crowds and a revival and go to a desert road.)**
- 3. What does the Holy Spirit tell Philip to do once he is on the desert road?**
(The Holy Spirit tells Philip to walk along beside the carriage he sees.)
- 4. Who is in the carriage? What is he doing? (The treasurer for the queen of Ethiopia is there. He's reading a prophecy about Jesus dying on the cross.)**
- 5. How does Philip start a conversation and end up sharing the Good News?**
(Philip asks the man if he understands what he's reading. The man says no. He invites Philip into the carriage. Philip answers the man's questions.)
- 6. Why does Philip agree to baptize the man? (The man believes that Jesus is the Son of God who died for his sins.)**
- 7. What are 2 ways that God leads Philip? (1.) God send an angel with a message 2.) God speaks in a quiet voice through the Holy Spirit.)**
- 8. Are you sensitive to the Holy Spirit's voice? Are you available when God asks you to do something? (Answers will vary.)**
- 9. Philip knows the Bible. How can you get to know the Bible more? (Read the Bible every day! Go to youth group, a Bible study, or church!)**
- 10. Philip waits until the man invites him into the carriage. What should you do if people are not ready? (Don't push! Stop sharing if they're not ready.)**
- 11. Philip knows how to share the gospel. How could you prepare to share?**
(Practice sharing the message with a friend.)
- 12. God loves multiplication! Explain how 1 person can change their nation.**
(The Ethiopian man goes back home and perhaps shares the message with 3 friends. If each of those 3 share the message with 3 others, the message will soon multiply!)
- 13. Philip looks for opportunities to share Jesus. Are you looking? Where is God sending you? (Answers will vary.)**
